On Sunday, the crowd in Jerusalem praised Jesus, shouting, "Hosanna, blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" Then, on Friday, the same people shouted, "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!" What happened? Why the change of heart? The Jewish people were looking for a Messiah, someone to free them from Roman rule. Jesus was their man, so they thought. So, when he came into Jerusalem on that fateful Sunday, they expected him to ride straight to the Roman governor and let him know it was time to step down, Jesus was in the house! But, Jesus did not do that. Instead, he went into the temple, rid it of the money changers and left town. The crowd was disappointed and mad. Jesus did not do what they wanted or expected him to do.

CHCS 2009 Candy Sale. . .

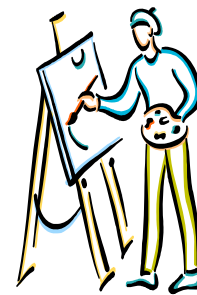

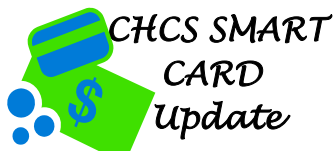
