Exodus 3 tells the famous story of Moses and the Burning Bush. We all know it well: Moses was tending sheep in the desert, minding his own business, having an ordinary day. Out of the corner of his eye he spots a bush on fire, but not consumed by it. This is a bush Moses had probably passed by 1,000 times before, but today, it was different. Today, it was an encounter with God Himself. God had a very important message he wanted to communicate with Moses, and he did it through a bush. Moses could have ignored it. He could have walked right by. However, he stopped. And, his life was changed forever.

I wonder how many "burning bushes" I've walked passed in my life. How many times has God tried to get my attention, and I have chosen to ignore it, preferring to live my life my way? Maybe I was too busy. Maybe I didn't want to get involved. Maybe I was just too tired. Maybe I didn't want to change. Whatever the reason, I can't help wonder how my life might have been different if I had been more willing to stop and hear what God had to say to me.

I think "burning bushes" can take many forms in our lives. Maybe it's a plea to volunteer. Maybe it's stopping to help fix a flat tire. Maybe it's taking more time with our children or our spouses. Maybe it's stopping to become breathless at the sight of a beautiful sunset or marveling at the sound of a symphony. God is trying to tell us He loves us, He needs us, He longs for us to experience life to its fullest.

The last weeks of the school year get busier and busier and busier. I urge each of us to remember to keep looking for those "burning bushes" - those opportunities to hear from God, to be used by God, and to grow in Him.

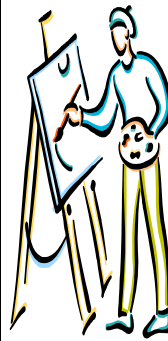
