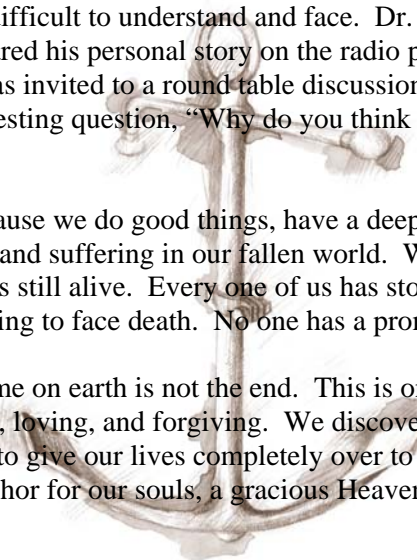
From the Principal's



Each of us has situations in our lives that are difficult to understand and face. Dr. David Jeremiah, pastor of Shadow Mountain Community Church in California, recently shared his personal story on the radio program, "Focus on the Family." Dr. Jeremiah is battling cancer. During his treatment, he was invited to a round-table discussion with other clergy who were all in the middle of a similar fight. The mediator asked an interesting question, "Why do you think **you**, of all people, have cancer?" Dr. Jeremiah responded, "Because I'm human."

This mediator did not understand that just because we do good things, have a deep faith in God, go to church every Sunday, and live for Christ, we are not immune to the pain and suffering in our fallen world. Why **not** us? There is not a single person who served God and did good works in 1820 who is still alive. Every one of us has storms in our lives, bends in the road we're traveling, reversals, setbacks. All of us are going to face death. No one has a promise of another breath.

Our hope, as followers of Christ, is that our time on earth is not the end. This is only our training ground. It is here that we learn who God is. We learn that He is faithful, loving, and forgiving. What a comfort to remember that we do have an anchor for our souls, a gracious Heavenly Father who has promised to never leave us or forsake us.

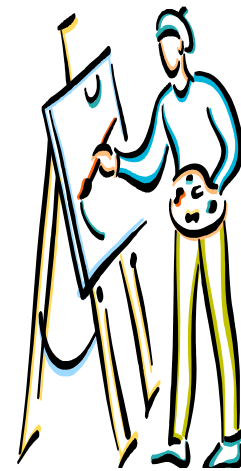

Flu Season will be fast upon us. One of the most effective preventative measures is careful hand washing. Here are some tips from the Cleveland Clinic to make sure your hand washing is effective.

- Wet your hands before you apply soap
- If you are using a bar of soap, make sure it is clean; sometimes dirt from previous use will stay on the bar
- With soap applied, rub your hands vigorously for about 20 seconds
- Don't forget to scrub your fingernails, in between your fingers, and the backs of your hands
- Rinse well—this will get the germs off
- After washing your hands, dry them with a disposable towel and then turn the water off using the towel (this will prevent recontamination)

Make sure you always wash your hands:

- After using the restroom
- Before and after preparing and eating food
- After having contact with animals or animal waste
- After being outside
- After sneezing or coughing
- After being around a sick person
- Before and after putting in and removing contact lenses
