From the Principal's



God often instructed His people to erect monuments of remembrance. Joshua commanded the Israelites to set up 12 stones to commemorate the miraculous crossing of the Jordan as they entered the Promised Land (Joshua 4). Taking time to reflect on what God has done and giving Him thanks is an important part of our identity as His people.

Nothing recalibrates our perspective like praise and worship; as one pastor said, "Praise is mental health insurance." The classic gospel song declares, "When I think of the goodness of Jesus, and all He's done for me, my soul cries out: Hallelujah!"

The biblical instructions to build a memorial to what God had done were intended to be more than reminders of the past. These monuments were also to inspire faithfulness to God in the future. Joshua depicted the stones of remembrance as important for the future of Israel: "In the future, when your children ask you, 'What do these stones mean?' tell them that the flow of the Jordan was cut off before the ark of the covenant of the LORD" (Josh. 4:6-7).

So as we are taking time to praise God for His faithfulness in the past year, we also look forward in faith to what He will do in the future. It is important that we take time to share with our children what God has done for our families. From these remembrances, we can face our futures with faith and confidence that the God who helped us in the past will be with us in days to come. Give thanks. Shout "Hallelujah!"

Ryan's Masterpiece can be viewed outside the Art room door.

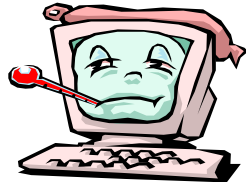

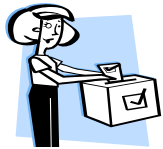

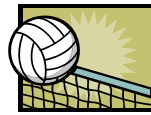
