From Mrs. Paredes



Here is an e-mail I received the other day from a friend. I loved the message found in the story and hope that we all think twice before we use unkind words or harsh tones.

There once was a little boy who had a bad temper. His father gave him a bag of nails and told him that every time he lost his temper, he must hammer a nail into the back of the fence. The first day the boy had driven 37 nails into the fence.

Over the next few weeks, as he learned to control his anger, the number of nails hammered daily gradually dwindled down. He discovered it was easier to hold his temper than to drive those nails into the fence.

Finally, the day came when the boy didn't lose his temper at all. He told his father about it and the father suggested that the boy now pull out one nail for each day that he was able to hold his temper. The days passed and the young boy was finally able to tell his father that all the nails were gone.

The father took his son by the hand and led him to the fence, he said, "You have done well, my son, but look at the holes in the fence. The fence will never be the same. When you say things in anger, they leave a scar just like this one. You can put a knife in a man and draw it out. But it won't matter how many times you say I'm sorry, the wound is still there."

A verbal wound is as bad as a physical one.

When we are angry, upset or tired, we, as humans, tend to take it out on our loved ones; the people that we are closest to, and who love us and accept us as we are. It is often shocking, the way we express ourselves, either by our tone or our actual words. The feeling of regret afterward is too often unbearable and the damage is already done. Asking for forgiveness from the people that we hurt is the first step, but apologizing does not fix all the damage that has been created by our careless words and quick temper. When you feel yourself beginning to crumble, pray that God would fill you with Peace and that he would take away your harsh words and thoughts before you cause the irreparable damage.

If this is something you struggle with, and even if you don't, a great book to read is Conversation Peace by Mary A. Kassian.

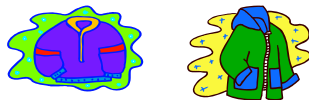
